The Astin Civic Engagement Research Program funds a select group of upper-division students who demonstrate a strong, ongoing commitment to civic engagement research. The program includes a "spring training" component in which selected students engage in a one-quarter internship with a community organization and enroll in a 2-unit seminar to create a formal research proposal. A select group of students who are chosen as Scholars will continue their internship for two more quarters, and conduct a comprehensive research project under the guidance of a faculty mentor. Spring training students enroll into Civic Engagement 95CE and Civic Engagement 194A during spring quarter of their junior year; selected Scholars enroll into Civic Engagement 195CE during the fall and winter quarters and enroll into Civic Engagement 199 course during spring of their senior year.
