

Philanthropy as CIVIC ENGAGEMENT

FALL 2013

Course Description

In this class, students will study the history, philosophy, and practice of philanthropy. Working with a generous grant of the *Once Upon a Time Foundation*, students will have the unique opportunity to distribute up to **\$100,000** to four local non-profit organizations that foster the arts, civil rights, environmental sustainability, as well as health and human services. The goal of this philanthropic educational program is to teach students about philanthropy and introduce to them the value of giving and community investments.

By the end of the course, students are expected to have selected four organizations to that will receive a *Once Upon a Time Foundation* grant. Each agency must be awarded at least \$10,000 and the grant cannot be split evenly among all four. Students are expected to engage in meaningful negotiation, collaboration, and consensus building.

Seminar, Mondays, 3 hours (4pm-7pm). Max of 18 juniors/seniors; permission of instructor required for enrollment.

Application Process

Before submitting an application, please note the following requirements. Students must:

1. Have accumulated 120 units with a GPA of 2.8 or higher (at end of winter quarter)
2. Have declared a major
3. Attend every class, which meets Monday, 4-7:00pm
4. Attend a special orientation event on Thursday, September 26, 2013 at 5:00pm
5. **Submit an online application between June 3 - 24, 2013**
6. Submit a copy of current resume (not to exceed 5,000 characters or approximately 2 pages)
